Abdul Hamid Mohamad is a member of the Shariah Advisory Council (SAC) of the Securities Commission Malaysia, Bank Negara Malaysia (Central Bank of Malaysia), Judiciary Appointment Commission Malaysia and the Chairman for the Advisory Board, Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission.

Abdul Hamid Mohamad was the former Chief Justice of Malaysia. He joined the judicial and legal services as a Magistrate in Perlis, Malaysia in 1969. He held various positions such as Assistant Director, Legal Aid Bureau; High Court Vice Registrar and Chief Prosecutor of Attorney General's Chamber. Abdul Hamid was then appointed as the Commissioner of Justice on 1 May 1990 and two years later, as a High Court Judge. He was appointed as the Court of Appeal Judge on 1 September 2000 and the Federal Court Judge on 1 August 2003 respectively. Following this, Abdul Hamid was appointed as the Federal Court President on 5 September 2007.

Among his published speeches and papers are "Jurisdiction of the Civil Courts in the Administration of Trust Properties in Malaysia" and "Judicial and Legal System in Malaysia: A Vision", "Civil and Shariah Courts in Malaysia: Conflict of Jurisdiction" and "Administration of Property: Civil Law and Shariah Law Perspective".

Abdul Hamid obtained his Bachelor of Law degree from National University of Singapore.
